
Dear Family,

No doubt you have heard of the passing of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI (Joseph Ratzinger), and perhaps you have heard about all the things he accomplished over his long productive life. You may have also heard all the criticism and name-calling he received from the news media, many politicians and even some of the hierarchy of the Church. All their attacks I saw as baseless reactions to his faithful observations on the problems in the modern world. Apparently, he struck a nerve.



It was these needless ad hominem criticisms of Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger that first captured my attention long ago. From then on, I read various articles about this man who was the Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (CDF) under Pope John Paul II. As a Protestant at the time, I found his writings to be very engaging and faithful. He was more than a scholar; he was a person of deep and abiding faith.



One of the appellations used by his unfaithful detractors was "God's Rottweiler." This was a name based on the German breed with a reputation for being a vicious attack dog. It so happened that around the same time, a children's book was published called Good Dog Carl. This was a loving story about a Rottweiler named Carl who tenderly cared for the infant in the home while the mother went out shopping. This book became very popular as it was translated into many different languages. God has surprising ways of helping his own.

Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger was strongly opposed for years by those who hated the Catholic Church, the traditional faith and ultimately hated God. When he was elected pope in 2005, I knew that this was the work of God, and I had no reason not to become Catholic. In 2009 Pope Benedict XVI came to America, and Deborah and I, along a number of others from our parishes, went to see him at a Mass with 47,000 other people at Washington Nationals Park. To date, he is the only Pope that I have seen in person. On the last day of his pontificate, he signed my rescript (permission granted) for me to be ordained a priest in the Catholic Church.

I have always felt a deep connection with this man who became pope. It was a position he never desired to have, but he did his best to serve the Church as long as he could. May he rest in peace.


The Pork Barbeque needs to cook for 7 hours, and it needs to be delivered to St. Charles by 8:30 a.m. on Wednesday January 18th.
