


#### **Craft Sale and Coffee Hour**

Dear Family,

Advent is the very time of the year when Catholics are very Catholic and very unlike the rest of the world. While many prepare for the secular Christmas of Santa Clause, gifts and spending lots of money, or by celebrating Christmas during this time before Christmas; we are preparing for the coming of Christ both as the child in Bethlehem as well as Christ coming in glory. There is nothing wrong with those other ways of celebration as long as one's mind and heart is centered upon this season of preparation.

One of those practices that we usually have is that of a penance service. Ours will be on Sunday afternoon, December 11 at 3:00pm at St. Charles Borromeo. We will once again have Fr. Tom Collins with us to hear confessions along with myself. This is not only a time of preparation, but it also fulfills one of the five precepts of the Church, which is to have the

Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once per year. As it is written, this is part of the minimum moral effort that every Catholic should follow for the salvation of their soul.

The other practice in Advent that has disappeared is the observation of "Ember Days." Ember Days are on Wednesday, Friday and Saturday, and they occur four times a year – between 1st and 2nd Sunday of Lent; between Pentecost and Trinity Sundays; the 3rd week of September, following Holy Cross Day, September 14; and between the 3rd and 4th Sunday in Advent, following St. Lucy's feast day, December 13. A mnemonic device to remember these four times is "Lenty, Penty, Crucy, Lucy."

On these four occasions, the whole Church is called to pray for vocations to Holy Priesthood. It is a practice that began in the year A.D. 222 with the order of Pope Callistus. It continued throughout the centuries until Pope Paul VI removed it from the calendar of the Church in 1966. It is a practice that we could embrace again in this time of falling vocations.

Ember Days this Advent are on Wednesday, Friday and Saturday, December 14<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup>, and 17<sup>th</sup>. It is a time of fasting and prayer. Fasting is done with one meal and two collations or snacks, and prayer especially for good and holy priests to be called to work for the harvest of souls. The words of our Lord that this calls to mind is "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." (Luke 10:2). This is not just something for the priests to observe, but the laity need to take up this practice as this for the good of the Church and for the good of their own souls, and the souls of others.

God bless you all, as you prepare yourselves for the Christmas feasts through prayer, fasting and penance.
