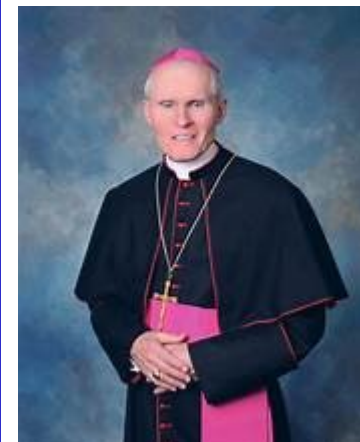

WELCOME TO BISHOP MARK BRENNAN



We welcome today Bishop Mark Brennan to our parishes. He is present at all three Masses this weekend, and we can be especially thankful to him for spending this much time with us.

He is a native of Boston, Massachusetts, and grew up in the Washington D.C. area. He graduated from Brown University in 1969 with a degree in history, and then entered Christ the King Seminary in Allegheny, New York for a year of philosophy before attending the Pontifical North American College in Rome for his theological studies. He has been a parish priest in the Archdiocese of Washington D.C. for most of his career.

Bishop Brennan attended Spanish Language courses and Hispanic cultural studies in the Dominican Republic and in Colombia from 1985-86. From 1988 to 1998, Bishop Brennan was the Director of Priestly Vocations in the Archdiocese of Washington. He was appointed Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Baltimore on December 5, 2016, and ordained on January 19, 2017. He was named as the ninth bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston on July 23, 2019, and was installed on August 22, 2019.

Bishop Brennan currently serves on the following committees for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: Administrative Committee; Migration Committee; National Advisory Committee; Priorities & Plans Committee; and the Pro-Life Committee.

He comes to us as one who has accomplished much and who holds a deep faith in Christ and his Church. Welcome him to our parishes. You will find him to be very approachable.

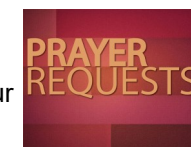
