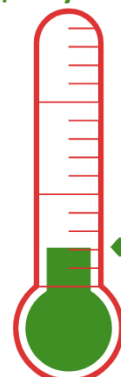

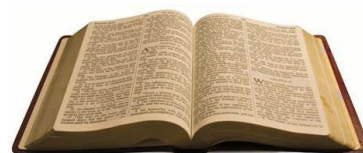

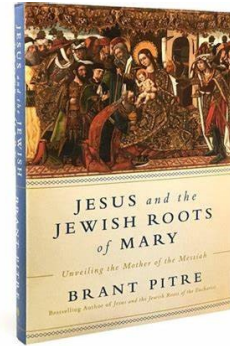

Dear Family,

The wonderful and very special season of Lent is upon us. It is a time for increased prayer, worship and devotion as we prepare for Easter. **Ash Wednesday** is this week, February 22, and our schedule for Ash Wednesday Mass with imposition of ashes is 12:00 noon at St. Charles Borromeo and 6:00 p.m. at St. Catherine of Siena.

We will also have **Stations of the Cross** on every Thursday evening of March at 6:00 p.m. at St. Catherine of Siena, and every Friday of March at 9:00 a.m. at St. Charles Borromeo.

Also, Lent is a season for additional study of our faith. This year our book for this Lenten study is **Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary** by Dr. Brant Pitre. The Blessed Virgin Mary is a unique subject for Catholics, and one that is often misunderstood by Protestants. It is for us as Catholics to clearly understand our devotion to Mary as the “Mother of God,” and the person to whom we are devoted more than any other. We do not worship her, but we recognize that God wants us to call her blessed above any other for her unique place in Salvation History.



As the Canticle called “Magnificat” in the Gospel of Luke states:

*“for (God my Savior) has regarded the low estate of his handmaiden.
For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed;” (Luke 1: 48)*

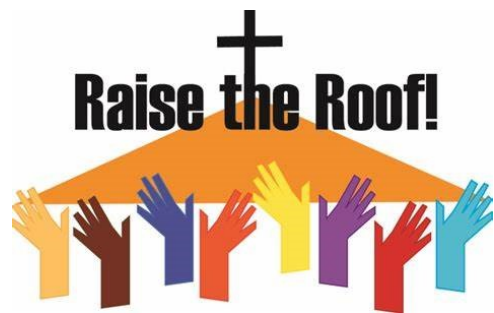
