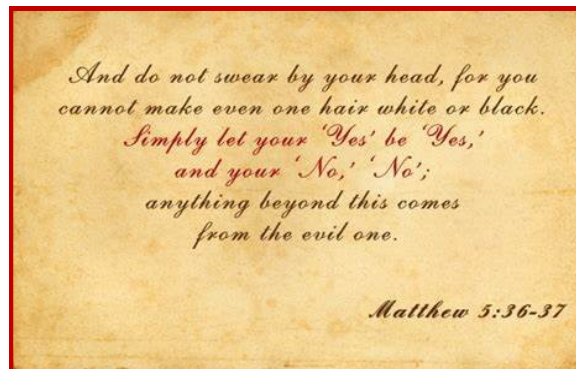

There will be **no weekday masses** February 13 through February 15th. Weekday masses will resume on Thursday February 16th at 6:30 p.m.

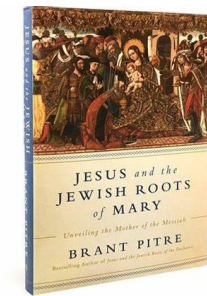
LENT

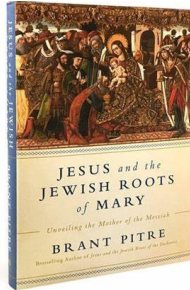

JOIN US for our Lenten Bible Study on Pitre's Book: *Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary*

LEARN THE ANSWERS to the following questions:

- What does the Bible tell us about Mary of Nazareth?
- Why do Catholics venerate Mary?
- What light does Jesus' identity shed on his mother?
- Are Catholic teachings on Mary really biblical, or are they the "traditions of men"?

- Did Mary actually remain a virgin her whole life or do the "brothers of Jesus" refer to her other children?
- By praying to Mary, are Catholics worshipping her?
- What does Mary have to do with the quest to understand Jesus?



In *Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary*, Dr. Pitre takes readers step-by-step from the Garden of Eden to the Book of Revelation to reveal how deeply biblical Catholic beliefs about Mary really are. Dr. Pitre uses the Old Testament and Ancient Judaism to unlock how the Bible itself teaches that Mary is in fact the new Eve, the Mother of God, the Queen of Heaven and Earth, and the new Ark of the Covenant.

Dr. Brant Pitre is Distinguished Research Professor of Scripture at the Augustine Institute, Graduate School of Theology. He earned his Ph.D. in Theology from the University of Notre Dame, where he specialized in the study of the New Testament and ancient Judaism.

Dr. Pitre is the author of the best-selling books, *Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist* (Image, 2011), *The Case for Jesus* (Image, 2015), and *Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary* (Image, 2018). He is also author of *Jesus and the Last Supper* (Eerdmans, 2015), co-author with John Bergsma of *A Catholic Introduction to the Bible: The Old Testament* (Ignatius, 2018), and co-author with Michael P. Barber and John Kincaid of *Paul, a New Covenant Jew* (Eerdmans, 2019). Dr. Pitre has also produced dozens of video and audio Bible studies, in which he explores the biblical foundations of Catholic faith and theology (available at BrantPitre.com). He currently lives in Louisiana with his wife Elizabeth and their five children.
