Lenten Friday Fish Dinners

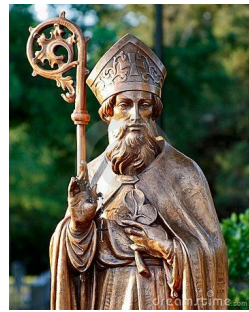

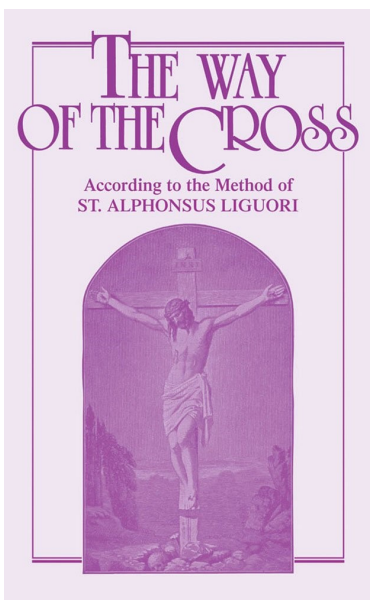
The **Stations of the Cross**, also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, commemorate Jesus's passion and death on the cross. There are 14 stations that each depict a moment on his journey to Calvary, through sacred art, prayers, and reflections. The practice began as pious pilgrims traced his path through Jerusalem on the Via Dolorosa. Later, for the many who wanted to pass along the same route, but could not make the trip to Jerusalem, a practice developed that eventually took the form of the fourteen stations currently found in almost every church throughout the world. Similarly, the 150 Hail Marys that were recited for the rosary were an adaptation of the medieval monastic practice of reciting the 150 psalms in the Psalter.

During Lent 2026 we will be reciting the Way of the Cross, or Stations of the Cross, on Thursdays at 6:30pm at Saint Catherine of Siena, and on Fridays at 6pm at Saint Charles Borromeo. Please join us.



St. Alphonsus Liguori was born in 1696 to Neapolitan nobility at Marianella, Italy. He became a recognizable lawyer after going through law school at the age of sixteen, but later decided to leave law in favor of giving his salvation more attention. Alphonsus joined the Oratory of St. Philip Neri as a seminarian and was ordained in 1726, when he was thirty. The homilies he gave had the special ability of converting those who had fallen away from the faith. He also founded the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, and authored such works as *The Glories of Mary*, *The True Spouse of Jesus Christ*, *Attaining Salvation*, *The Blessed Virgin Mary*, *Preparation for Death Abridged*, *What Will Hell Be Like?*, *The Twelve Steps to Holiness and Salvation*, and *The Way of the Cross*.

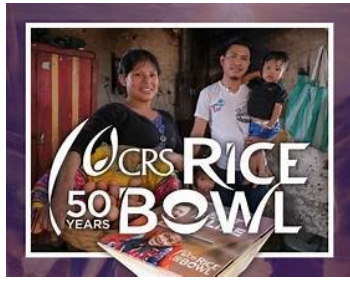
After being a bishop for over a decade, St. Alphonsus Liguori died on the first of August, 1787. He was canonized by Pope Gregory XVI in 1839, and declared a Doctor of the Church in 1871. His feast is celebrated on August 1.

LENT BEGINS

WHAT IS LENT? The 40-day period from Ash Wednesday and before Easter Sunday. It is marked by prayer, fasting, abstinence, and other acts of penance.

PRAYING ----- FASTING ----- ABSTINENCE

WHAT IS FASTING?

One meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed one full meal.

DAYS OF FAST?

Ash Wednesday Good Friday

WHO ARE REQUIRED? Catholics from age < 18 to 59 >

The sick and expectant mothers are excused from fasting.

WHAT IS ABSTINENCE?

Abstinence is refraining from eating meat. Meat is considered to be the flesh and organs of mammals and fowl.

DAYS OF ABSTINENCE?

Ash Wednesday All Fridays of Lent Good Friday

WHO ARE REQUIRED? Mandatory for everyone
