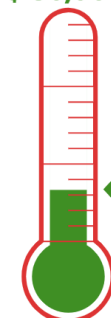

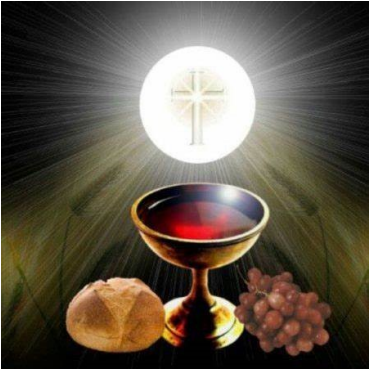

Dear Family,
I have recently received a letter from Bishop Mark Brennan concerning the Mass. First, I will not need to wear a mask during Holy Communion. You, however, have not had to wear masks for some time, and you can, of course, continue to do so or not.

I will continue the usual procedure of washing hands before Mass, an ancient practice that in the Latin Mass is accompanied with a prayer. Before the Eucharistic Prayer, I apply hand sanitizer, which evaporates by the time of Holy Communion begins (not an ancient practice!). Then just before and during Communion, I use grain alcohol (Everclear) on my fingers. That’s the little dish next to me. All of this is to give you confidence that we are doing everything to prevent passing disease to you.

Secondly, “tactile” passing of the peace may return immediately. You have used “non-tactile” passing of the peace over the past three years, but now handshakes, etc., may resume.

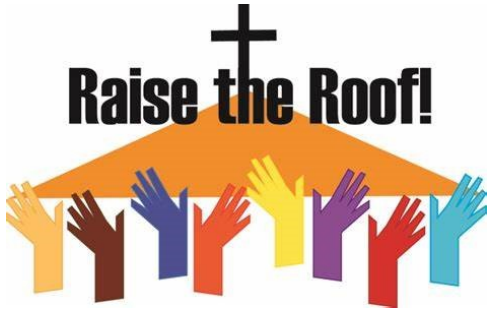
Third, the chalice is to be returned to the laity. This will begin on Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023 and thereafter. This means that the Precious Blood will be offered on Easter this year. There is evidence that this was the usual practice of the Church until the Council of Constance in 1416. At that time, the chalice was withdrawn from the laity for fear of spilling the precious blood. Communing the laity in “One Kind” was the practice of the Church until 1970. At that time, following the Second Vatican Council, the chalice was once again returned to the faithful.



This latest withdrawal of the Chalice was not faith driven but health driven, and concern about spreading disease. However, it was based on a teaching of the Church that the fullness of Christ’s body, blood, soul, and divinity is contained in every particle of the Sacred Host and every drop of the Precious Blood. Therefore, if one receives Christ in the Sacred Host only, one receives the fullness of Christ. Considering this doctrine of the Church, anyone can receive the Holy Communion in the Sacred Host alone or in both kinds; it is your choice.

The important thing in all this is to know that in receiving Holy Communion, you are receiving the risen Lord Jesus Christ. That reality is far above concerns about health and disease, it is about your eternal destiny. It is also about recognizing the transcendent gift that is given to us, and the thanksgiving we give in return to our Lord, creator, and savior.
