

Dear Family,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This is the second of three great solemnities that crown the Easter Season: Pentecost, Most Holy Trinity and Corpus Christi. Each of these emphasize an aspect of the Eternal God that is necessary to our understanding of God and of how we worship Him.

The Holy Spirit emphasized in Pentecost, is the third person of the Trinity, whom St. Paul tells us, *“The Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words.”* (Rom. 8:26). The Holy Spirit is a “person” not a “thing,” who indwells the Church by which the Church is made holy, and who indwells each of us who believe and follow Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Today we take up the nature of God, revealed in Jesus Christ as One God in Three Persons. It tells us that at the very center of all existence is not only the one, unique God, but also a community of love. When we truly pray and worship, we are invited into this eternal conversation between the three persons of the Trinity.

Next Sunday we will observe Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. In that occasion we will enter into the great mystery of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. We will find that this article of our faith is the third necessary part of our worship of the Most Holy God.

God bless you all as we give thanks to God that he has revealed to us the mysteries of our faith that we could not know by our own faculties.


So far we have raised \$ 65,765.
