

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Among the reforms promoted by the Second Vatican Council was the encouragement to involve members of the lay faithful more directly in the administrative, liturgical, and ministerial life of the Church. In the liturgical life, opportunities for lay men and women expanded to include serving as Readers and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, in addition to a broadening of those welcomed to serve at the Altar and allowing persons not seeking Holy Orders to be enrolled as Acolytes. In the ministerial life, several new and very valuable ministries sprang up and continue to flourish in the life of Church, such as bereavement ministries, OCIA, and a myriad of new charitable endeavors. And around administration, the formation of Parish Pastoral Councils and Parish Finance Councils are important means of consulting the faithful, hearing their needs and concerns, and involving them in the governance of the Church.

The Code of Canon Law requires Parish Finance Councils and the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston mandates Parish Pastoral Councils. After spending these first two months getting to know something of the parishes, chapels, and people within our Parochial Cluster, I have come to realize that I need to be able consult you, the faithful, not merely on financial matters but also on matters of pastoral concern. Moreover, I have also realized the importance of having a Constitution and associated By-Laws for our Finance Councils – as well as for our newly forming Pastoral Councils – so that the work of each body might be clear to all and that those being appointed or elected might be able to discern whether they wish to serve. To that end, making use of *The Code of Canon Law*, resources from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Diocesan Fiscal Managers Conference, and from the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, I have drafted a Constitution and By-Laws for a newly erected Pastoral Council and reformed Finance Council at each Parish. I will post copies of each on the respective Parish's bulletin boards. If you would like your own copy, please email me (kquirk@dwc.org) or the Parish office to acquire an e-copy.

While I am working on Finance Council membership, I also want to begin the process of accepting nominations for each Parish's Pastoral Council. Nomination forms will be available in the narthex of each Church beginning with this weekend's Masses and nominations will remain open throughout the month of September. Please complete the form and drop it in the collection basket. The counters will set the nomination forms aside for tabulation. Once the nominations are complete and nominees have accepted, elections will occur toward the end of October, so that our new Pastoral and Finance Council members might be inaugurated on the First Sunday of Advent at both Parishes, a new liturgical year commencing with newly formed Councils with whom the pastor may consult.

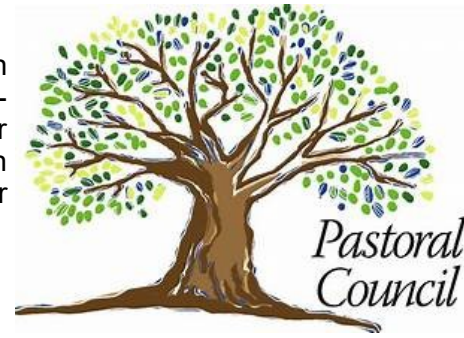

Italian Cream Cake Cookies

<p>Ingredients for Cookie Dough: 1 cup salted butter, at room temp. ½ cup white sugar 2 eggs at room temperature, separated 1 tsp vanilla extract 1 tsp almond extract 2 cups all-purpose flour 1/8 tsp salt 1 cup shredded sweetened COCONUT</p>	<p>Ingredients for Icing: 1 (8 oz) package cream cheese, softened ¼ cup salted butter, softened 1 tsp vanilla extract 1 tsp almond extract 1 cup powdered sugar ½ cup shredded sweetened coconut 1 cup finely chopped pecans</p>

Prep Time: 30 min **Cook Time:** 15 min **Additional Time:** 55 min **Total Time:** 1hr 40min

- Combine butter and sugar in large bowl; beat with electric mixer on high speed until creamy, about 2 minutes. Add egg yolks, vanilla, and almond extract; beat until combined. Add flour and salt; mix until just combined. Stir in coconut, making sure it is evenly distributed throughout the dough. Refrigerate dough for about 30 minutes.
- Meanwhile, make the frosting. Beat cream cheese and butter together until creamy. Add vanilla and almond extract, then gradually stir in powdered sugar until frosting is creamy. Stir in coconut. Refrigerate icing about 30 minutes.
- Preheat oven to 350 degrees (175 C). Line baking sheets with parchment paper.
- Beat egg whites in small bowl until bubbly and frothy. Pour pecans into shallow bowl.
- Shape cookies by rolling cold dough into 1-inch balls. Dip dough into egg whites then roll in the pecans until covered. Arrange on prepared baking sheets. Gently press down with thumb to make small well in center of each cookie.
- Bake in preheated oven until slightly firm, about 15 min. Cool on baking sheets for few minutes. Move to
