



Schedule for Masses on Christmas Weekend

St. Jerome (347-420) in his study

Dear Family,

Remember the homily from last Sunday? I talked about the John the Baptist in prison, expecting execution by King Herod. He sent his disciples to Jesus to ask him a question: "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" The view of modernist skepticism was that John who was in prison and at the end of his life, was plagued by doubt that all he had done as the forerunner of the Messiah was for naught. However, St. Jerome, the great biblical scholar and saint of the 4th century saw this very differently. John had given his disciples the perfect question to discover for themselves that Jesus was the Messiah, the "One who is to come."



Skepticism can be the philosophical trap of our times that leads many astray from a life filled with the joy of faith in the God through whom all things are

possible. Skepticism has also found its voice concerning the story of our gospel passage today.

A bishop of a protestant church not long ago, became very famous and a popular speaker and writer on biblical studies. He was a skeptic, saying that the bible should not be taken literally, and that most stories were meant to give us some sense of that these events only symbolically told of great people (perhaps like himself!). He also taught that Mary became pregnant by some unknown man, and Joseph, a simple man, believed that it was by God, not willing to believe that his wife was an adulteress. He also taught that there was no such thing as virgin birth. Many people were taken in by his heretical teachings, which he claimed was more "scientific." All of them were carried away from faith and into the darkness of skepticism.

For us and for the teachings of the Church, we are given the literal truth that tells us that miracles happen, that God is real, and that we can be lifted up by faith in the word of God that fills us with hope and tells of the love of God.

That is the message of the coming Christmas story; a message that, even in the darkest of times, life is filled with wonder and the light of the living God.

May God richly bless you all.
