Dear Family,

This coming Tuesday is November 1, “All Saints Day.” There are saints’ days throughout the year for particular saints, but this day is for all the saints, especially for those not named in our calendar. So, what is a saint?

A saint is simply a person who is in heaven. The Church names saints from time to time in a “Canonization Mass,” usually celebrated by the Pope. However, there are people in heaven who are not officially named by the Church. These people are saints also, just as those who have been “canonized.” To be canonized is to be added to the canon, or authorized list, of the saints recognized by the Church.

There are four steps for a person being named a saint:

1. It begins locally with a group of people who recognize that someone who has passed away was an extraordinarily holy person. The “Cause for Sainthood” is then presented to the local bishop for consideration. If the person is accepted by the bishop, then the candidate for sainthood is named a “**Servant of God.**” The person and along with their cause is passed on to the Vatican for consideration.
2. The Vatican Congregation for the Causes of Saints then investigates the Servant of God to determine if they lived a life of “Heroic Virtue.” This does not mean that they were perfect, but they had a reputation of diligently pursuing holiness. If the Congregation finds, after detailed investigation, that this is a holy person with fruits of holiness in their life, then they are called “**Venerable.**”
3. The cause for sainthood is then presented to the pope along with a miracle associated with the person, indicating that the candidate has interceded in heaven for someone’s healing or another miracle. Then the pope can consider the case and celebrate a “Beatification Mass.” The candidate from sainthood is then called “**Blessed.**”
4. The last step requires a second miracle, and if the pope accepts the evidence for sainthood, and if any negative reports are rejected, then the pope names the candidate a “**Saint,**” and a feast day is determined, and the Canonization Mass is celebrated.

All these steps are accomplished with great care and diligence, and we are encouraged to pray to these saints for our own needs. The Church is not made up of the people who happen to be alive on earth at this time, but also includes all those who are in purgatory for whom we pray and those in heaven who pray for us. We are a part of a great body of people in the temporal and the eternal realms. We all have our part to play in this drama of salvation.
