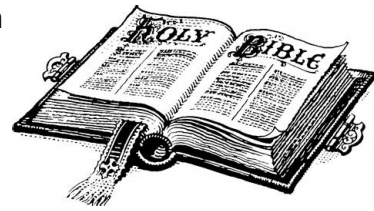

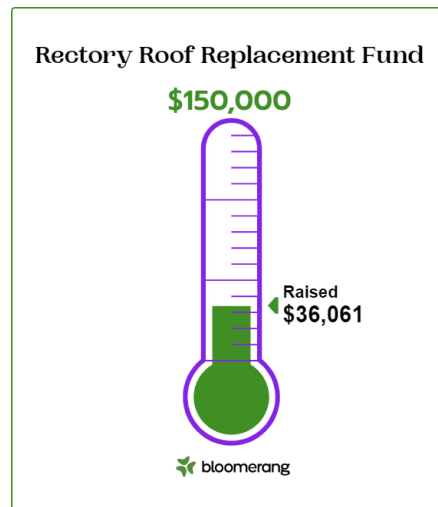
**RECTORY ROOF REPLACEMENT**

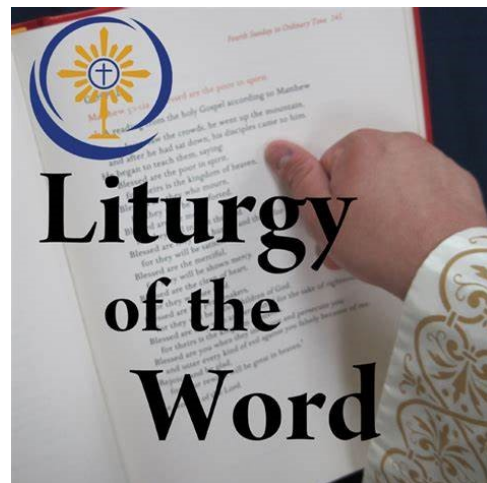

Dear Family,  
I have been writing about the Mass, the various parts of it, and the meaning of what we do together as we engage in it. The first part of the Mass is the Liturgy of the Word, which begins with the Introductory Rite.

The beginning of the Mass is either a short passage called the Introit, but more typically on Sunday, the Entrance Hymn. Usually, this hymn introduces a theme of the Mass. Immediately following the hymn is the Sign of Cross, which is a prayer in and of itself; then the greeting, the penitential rite by which we prepare ourselves for encountering Christ by acknowledging our sins and praying for God's forgiveness. Finally, we have the "Kyrie" (Lord have Mercy), the gloria and the opening prayer called the "Collect," by which our prayers are collected together.

The major part of the "Liturgy of the Word" comes next. We read various passages from the Bible and focus on the words of scripture as the Word of the Lord. Our intent at that time is to listen to what God is saying to you, personally. The listening ear will find something that speaks to them.



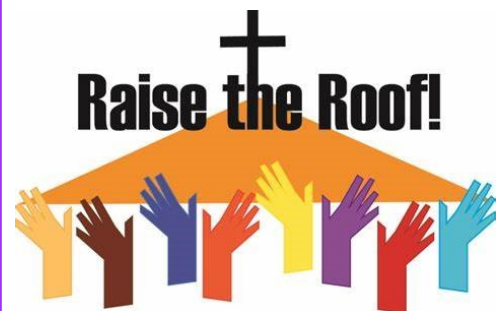
The responses to the readings are a series of things: the Homily, the Creed, and the Prayers of the Faithful. These are integral parts that come from listening to the Word of God – the meditations of the Celebrant, the ancient profession of faith of the Church, and our prayers that are offered from our hearts in the context of what we have heard.

The next part of the Mass is the Liturgy of the Eucharist, which I will write about next. God bless you all as we worship, pray, and honor God together.
