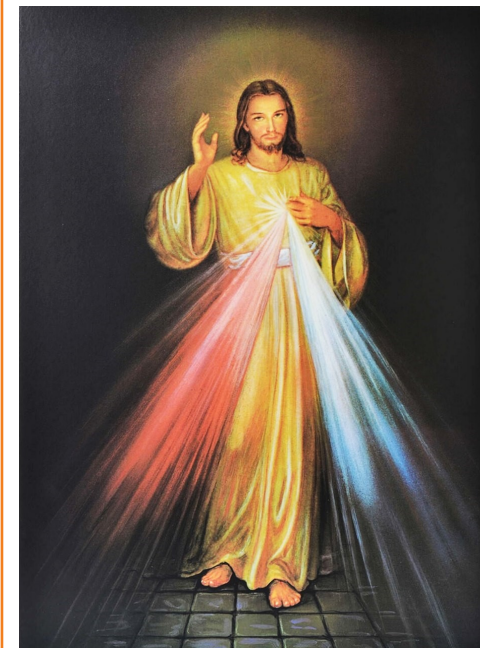

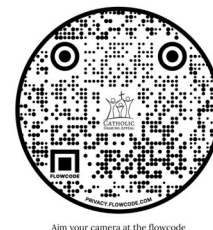

Dear parish family,

I write to express profound gratitude for the thoughtful cards, phone calls, and meals you lavished upon Ann and me during my hospitalization and initial chemotherapy cycles. Your generosity and manifold kindnesses have been—during some especially difficult periods—a primary stream of my encouragement. I am also grateful for the generous pastoral care and support I received from Msgr Kevin Quirk and Fr Jim Conyers. The love and care this parish have freely expressed toward our family through words of encouragement, gestures of compassion, and supplications, daily remind me of how blessed I am, as an Anglo-Catholic priest (something of an outlier!), to enjoy the privilege of being, in the truest sense, a part of your parish family. Ann and I pray daily for the clergy and laity of this parish at Terce and Compline. While my response to the prescribed therapies has showed promise, I am yet unable to do perform some of the duties I took for granted until last fall—a situation that has opened new opportunities to devote more time to daily intercessory prayer. I consider it a privilege to pray for you as I continue my recovery and invite you to contact me if you wish me to add your name or the names of those near and dear to you to my intercessions. I am aware that many of you also grapple with tremendous difficulties and I value the opportunity to pray for you.

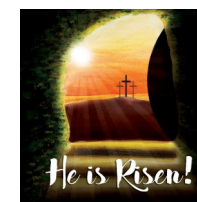
