Dear Family,

February 2nd is coming soon. It is the “Feast of the Presentation of the Lord,” also known as “The Feast of the Purification of Mary,” and as “**Candlemas**.” This year it is on Friday, so **Candlemas** will be celebrated at the 8:30 a.m. Mass at St. Charles Borromeo. Besides participation in a great feast day of the Church, everyone will receive a blessed candle. A blessed candle is a good thing to have and use in your own home. (“May it be a light to you in dark places, when all other lights go out.” - J.R.R. Tolkien, Fellowship of the Ring.)

This feast day is significant in the life of the Church, and it has been celebrated since the very early years of Christianity. It is perhaps best known in the Rosary as the Fourth Joyful Mystery, “The Presentation of Our Lord at the Temple,” and it is accounted in scripture at Luke 2:22-40.

In the passage, Mary and Joseph bring the baby Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem, following the Law of Moses to present their first-born male child and for the “purification” of his mother 40 days after the birth. The prophet Simeon is at the Temple to greet the Holy Family. He takes the child into his arms and pronounces the canticle *Nunc Dimittis*, which is third of the three great canticles associated with the birth of John the Baptist and of Jesus. These three canticles (spiritual songs) are said or sung every day at morning prayer, evening prayer and night prayer in the Divine Office.



The *Nunc Dimittis* is at the heart of the passage, and it is as follows:

Lord, now let thy servant depart in peace,
according to thy word.
For my eyes have seen thy salvation,
which thou have prepared for all the world to see.
A light to enlighten the nations,
And the glory of thy people, Israel.

In this canticle, we come to know that Simeon has been waiting for a long time to see the Anointed One, and now that God has revealed the Messiah to him, he can die in peace. Then he said even more; that he has seen in this child the salvation of his people and the light of God to all the nations. Therefore, all that the people of Israel have been given to do by God, has been accomplished.

This theme of God’s light to the world is picked up in the Mass by the blessed and lighted candles. In the *usus antiquior* (the old Mass, or Mass of the ages), this feast was the end of the Christmas Season. It is still a good conclusion for our Christmas celebration.
