The music for Sunday's communion was written by Johann F. Peter (1746-1813). The text for the piece is from Psalm 25. Tim Holbrook will be singing the piece in the original German language: *Leite Mich in Deiner Wahrheit*, accompanied by the harpsichord. The English translation is: Lead me in your truth and teach me, O Lord. For you are the God of my salvation. Daily I wait for you.

We need people to bake **Italian Cream Cake Cookies** for the dinner. Please Vanessa at 540-599-5699 if you can help by baking a few dozen cookies. See recipe at right.

Italian Cream Cake Cookies

Cookie Dough:
1 cup salted butter, at room temperature
½ cup white sugar
2 eggs at room temperature, separated
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 teaspoon almond extract
2 cups all-purpose flour
½ teaspoon salt
1 cup shredded sweetened coconut



Icing:
1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened
¼ cup salted butter, softened
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 teaspoon almond extract
1 cup powdered sugar
½ cup shredded sweetened coconut, or to taste
1 cup finely chopped pecans

Combine butter and sugar in a large bowl; beat with an electric mixer on high speed until creamy, about 2 minutes. Add egg yolks, vanilla, and almond extract; beat until combined. Add flour and salt; mix until just combined. Stir in coconut, making sure it is evenly distributed throughout the dough. Refrigerate dough for about 30 minutes. Meanwhile, make the frosting. Beat cream cheese and butter together until creamy. Add vanilla and almond extract, then gradually stir in powdered sugar until frosting is creamy. Stir in coconut. Refrigerate icing to infuse the flavors, about 30 minutes. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Line baking sheets with parchment paper. Beat egg whites in a small bowl until bubbly and frothy. Pour pecans into a shallow bowl. Shape the cookies by rolling the cold dough into 1-inch balls. Dip dough into the egg whites then roll in the pecans until covered. Arrange on the prepared baking sheets. Gently press down with your thumb to make a small well in the center of each cookie. Bake in the preheated oven until slightly firm, about 15 minutes. Allow to cool on the baking sheets for a few minutes to firm up. Move cookies to a wire rack. Cool completely before filling with frosting.

Dear Family,
Conversion is the theme that runs through our readings today. Conversion is a moral change, a turning or returning to God and to the precepts of the true religion. Every person is bound by the natural law to seek the truth, embrace it when found, and conform his life to its principles and precepts. (Catholic Encyclopedia)

Ezekiel writes about conversion today: "if (someone) turns from the wickedness he has committed, and he does what is right and just, then he shall preserve his life." Psalm 25 is a prayer for conversion: "Your ways, O LORD, make known to me; teach me your paths, guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my savior." Then we hear from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians: "Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus. Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also for those of others." This is a call to **conversion** to be like Christ in so far as we are able. He speaks of this characteristic, which, through the grace of God, we can follow: to look out for the interest of others, as Christ did for you and me.



Finally, St. Paul uses this canticle, which was probably familiar to the early Church, to give them exactly what Our Lord Jesus has done for us and for the whole world: "Jesus, though was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form he humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross."

Here, St. Paul is saying, is the source and the reason for our **conversion**. This Jesus, who is equal to God, emptied himself taking the form of a servant. God becomes a servant. This is unthinkable in Judaism, unknown in any other religion. Taking upon himself that which God cannot take – death. But in human form he has taken upon himself our death. Therefore, we who have been **converted** by God's grace, have taken upon ourselves the will of God and the ability to empty ourselves of our own self will, self-seeking, to give ourselves to the good of others. We can live more closely to Christ, to know more fully the freedom of being unified to his life.
