40 HOURS DEVOTION

The **40 Hours Devotion** dates back to 1527 when it was introduced by St. Anthony Mary Zaccaria in the Italian cities of Milan and Vicenza, and was later spread by St. Ignatius of Loyola and the Society of Jesus.

Originally called **Quarant'ore** in Italian, it was conceived as forty hours of continuous prayer before our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, either in one parish or in several parishes in successive periods of Eucharistic Adoration, the devotion has taken different forms over the years.

As part of our observance of the Parish Year of the Eucharistic Revival, the parishes of the Beckley Vicariate will be hosting **40 Hours Devotion** during the month of November, concluding with a Mass of Reposition on Monday, November 20 at 6 p.m. at St. Francis de Sales Parish in Beckley.

St. Charles Borromeo will host Adoration on **Saturday November 18, 2023** from 2:30—3:30 p.m.

The more I learned about my faith, the more I wanted to dedicate my life entirely to it and so, after working as an RN for about a year, I decided that it was time to enter the seminary. Now, I am blessed to spend my first assignment as a priest at St. John's. In my free time, I still love to cook and give occasional unwanted medical advice. I also love the outdoors, reading, and "tinkering" with things that are broken or in need of maintenance.

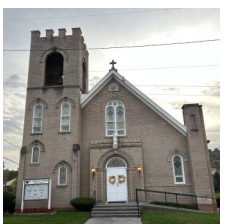

National Vocation Awareness Week

National Vocation Awareness Week, celebrated this year from Nov. 5-12th, is an annual weeklong celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promoting vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life through prayer and education.

It is also a time for the faithful to renew prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations.

The U.S. bishops ask the faithful to: “Please ask Our Lord for more dedicated holy priests, deacons, and consecrated men and women. May they be inspired by Jesus Christ, supported by our faith community, and respond generously to God’s gift of vocation.”

National Vocation Awareness Week began in 1976 when the U.S. bishops designated the 28th Sunday of the year for NVAW. In 1997, this celebration was moved to coincide with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which fell on January 13 in 2013. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen ✝



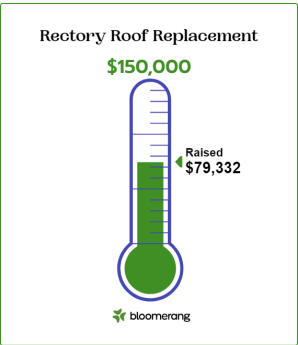
ROOF REPLACEMENT UPDATE

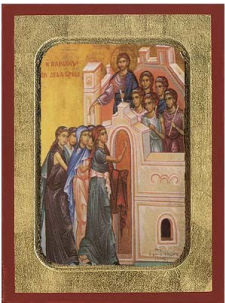
