40 HOURS DEVOTION

The **40 Hours Devotion** dates back to 1527 when it was introduced by St. Anthony Mary Zaccaria in the Italian cities of Milan and Vicenza, and was later spread by St. Ignatius of Loyola and the Society of Jesus. Originally called **Quarant'ore** in Italian, it was conceived as forty hours of continuous prayer before our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, either in one parish or in several parishes in successive periods of Eucharistic Adoration, the devotion has taken different forms over the years.

As part of our observance of the Parish Year of the Eucharistic Revival, the parishes of the Beckley Vicariate will be hosting **40 Hours Devotion** during the month of November, concluding with a Mass of Reposition on Monday, November 20 at 6 p.m. at St. Francis de Sales Parish in Beckley.

St. Charles Borromeo will host Adoration on **Saturday November 18**, from 2:30—3:30 p.m.

Please join us as you are able as together we witness to our faith in our Lords' presence in the Eucharist!

Dear Family,

You may have seen the people working on our roof last week. They have completed phase one of the rectory roof at St. Charles Borromeo. The job has been divided into two phases so that we can take advantage of a Diocesan grant for each year. Also, we have another grant coming in from an anonymous donor which we hope to receive in a couple of months.

The main thing, however, has been your generosity. I thank you all so much for your gifts. This new roof will last for many decades, and the Rectory serves many purposes for the good of both parishes.

I especially thank the people of St. Catherine for their help and generosity. It is always good when we work together as sister parishes. We are separate parishes but in the same family!

You gave a total of \$74,009. That is a significant amount for a relatively small parish. In addition, we made \$5,323 from the spaghetti dinner. (This amount is slightly more than the original total of \$5,173, since we received an additional donation after the spaghetti dinner!) What a surprising amount, which came from the tireless efforts of many of you.

Thank you for supporting your church, and in the words of St. Lawrence, you are the treasure of the Church.

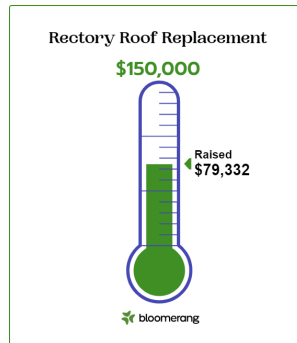
ROOF REPLACEMENT UPDATE

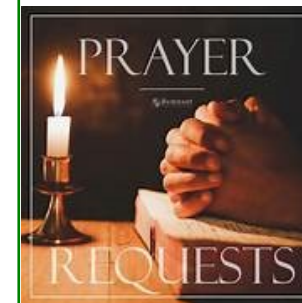

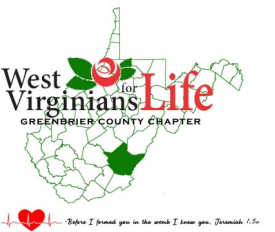
