

## 3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER



Relief efforts continue across the Mountain State after the severe flooding that occurred earlier this month. West Virginia encountered tornados, microbursts, strong winds, heavy rains, and mudslides. Several counties have experienced moderate-to-substantial flooding, notably along the Ohio River and its tributaries. The National Weather Service has confirmed 5 tornadoes in West Virginia – Huntington (Cabell/Wayne Counties), St. Albans, Cross Lanes, and Quick (Kanawha County), and Lavista (Fayette County).

A State of Emergency has been declared in 17 West Virginia Counties. Most Rev. Mark Brennan, Bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, has approved a special collection to be held the weekend of **April 20-21, 2024**, in all parishes and missions throughout the diocese to support recovery efforts related to the series of disasters that have occurred. Checks should be made out to your local parish with "Disaster Relief" on the memo line. Donations can also be made on the diocesan website at <https://dwc.org/disaster-relief/>.



Proceeds from this collection will support the long-term humanitarian and recovery efforts of Catholic Charities West Virginia. Their offices assist families long after other organizations have moved out. The role of Catholic Charities will last months and years as they help families and individuals in the rebuilding process to restore safe, secure, and sanitary living conditions. All of the money raised will stay in West Virginia to assist our neighbors.

Please remember in prayer all those whose lives have been changed in the wake of these disasters. Let us come together now to support our brothers and sisters in Christ who have been injured and lost their homes, cars, employment, and access to food and water.

Celebrating 100 years!

Bill Huff has been a faithful member of St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church for over 75 years. You can see him sitting near the center aisle at the 9 a.m. Mass every Sunday. He also oversaw the consturction of the current St. Charles church and the rectory building.

Born on April 6, 1924, William E. “Bill” Huff was raised in White Sulphur Springs and Renick, West Virginia. As a child, Bill spent most of his summers in Renick with his much-loved grandparents, learning about cattle, horses, and life in the country. He enjoyed simple pleasures like eating his grandmother’s mincemeat before she could bake it into a pie, teaching his cousin Bob Whiting to ride the horse, trying with Bob to dig a hole to China, and damming up a creek that later washed out the road during a torrential rainstorm.

Bill was fortunate to have met the love of his life when he was in sixth grade. Margaret was the younger sister of Bill’s lifelong friends, Leo and Vincent O’Neil. In high school at White Sulphur Springs High School, Bill acquired a lifelong love of football, where he played with Leo and Vincent O’Neil. Immediately after graduation, Bill and Leo enlisted in the United States Marine Corps, as Vincent had previously done in 1942 and who earned a Silver Star for his service. Following his discharge from the Marines in March 1946, he enrolled at West Virginia University and later transferred to West Virginia Tech where he obtained his degree in Industrial Arts with the help of the GI Bill.

In 1948 he married Margaret O’Neil at St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church. Together they raised four children, always stressing faith, family, and country. Bill taught school, served on the local school board, built homes, raised cattle, and was named on the 1960 Greenbrier County ballot along with President John F. Kennedy when Kennedy ran for President, and Bill ran for the school board.

Second to his service in the Marines, Mr. Huff is most proud of providing college educations for his children and serving as the associate superintendent for the Greenbrier County Schools. He oversaw building the two high schools that consolidated the many small county high schools into two large high schools to provide better educational opportunities for the students of Greenbrier County.

At 100 years old, he is still active politically, sharing his views openly, and supporting local and national candidates for election. His views are well known by the signs in his yard. Helping others in need is something that he has done his entire life. He still mows the yards of several of his neighbors while driving his new John Deere tractor and his last words to everyone when they visit or call is always., “Let me know if you need anything and I’ll be right there,” which is the sentence that defines his life.
