## 4TH SUNDAY OF EASTER

### SPECIAL COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND FOR WEST VIRGINIA FLOOD VICTIMS

Relief efforts continue across the Mountain State after the severe flooding that occurred earlier this month. West Virginia encountered tornados, microbursts, strong winds, heavy rains, and mudslides. Several counties have experienced moderate-to-substantial flooding, notably along the Ohio River and its tributaries. The National Weather Service has confirmed 5 tornadoes in West Virginia – Huntington (Cabell/Wayne Counties), St. Albans, Cross Lanes, and Quick (Kanawha County), and Lavista (Fayette County). A State of Emergency has been declared in 17 West Virginia Counties.

Most Rev. Mark Brennan, Bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, has approved a special collection to be held the weekend of **April 20-21, 2024**, in all parishes and missions throughout the diocese to support recovery efforts related to the series of disasters that have occurred. Checks should be made out to your local parish (St. Charles or St. Catherine) with “Disaster Relief” on the memo line.

Proceeds from this collection will support the long-term humanitarian and recovery efforts of Catholic Charities West Virginia. Their offices assist families long after other organizations have moved out. The role of Catholic Charities will last months and years as they help families and individuals in the rebuilding process to restore safe, secure, and sanitary living conditions. All of the money raised will stay in West Virginia to assist our neighbors.



Please remember in prayer all those whose lives have been changed in the wake of these disasters.

Let us come together now to support our brothers and sisters in Christ who have been injured and lost their homes, cars, employment, and access to food and water. Thank you for your generosity.

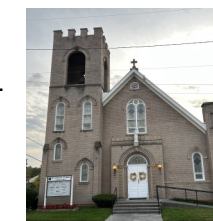

Dear Family,

Deborah shared this meditation from the “Magnificat” reading for April 16. It is a letter written by **Blessed Carl Lampert** (+1944), an Austrian priest who was killed by the Nazis for his outspoken resistance. He was beatified in 2011. He wrote this letter to his brother two hours before his execution.

“The hour has now come—the hour so terrible for you and for all who love me, the hour of liberation for me. On the Way of the Cross, I am approaching the last station; there has been darkness, but the day is dawning. “In you, Lord, I have hoped. Alleluia!


I can give you nothing further but my brotherly love and care, enduring beyond the grave. For love after all does not die, and now I am carrying it to the fountainhead of all love, to God, and there it will become even deeper, purer, firmer, and more potent.... Oh, how glad I am that this bitter suffering is finally coming to an end--I am on my way home, and nevertheless I remain with you.’

I have just received the supreme visitation...my last Communion. So, I enter upon the final sacrifice at four o'clock, with the *Confiteor* (“I confess”) of my heart’s faithfulness. With the *Kyrie eleison* of the poor sinner, with the last *Gloria in excelsis* and *Credo in unum Deum*, my last adoration of Christ in the Eucharist...oh how thankful I am to him...and now this last Communion before the great final one. And so, rejoicing, I recite my *Ite, missa est*—*consummatum est* (“Go forth, the Mass is ended—it is finished”) and once more I bless all of you, all who are bound to me by ties of blood, love, vocation, and especially suffering. Lord, now let your servant go in peace. My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord!”

This is a wonderful testament of belief in Eternal Life. May we all attain to such faith.


