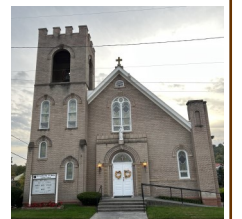

Dear Family and Friends,

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!

This is the greeting that Greek Christians give to one another on Easter (except in Greek, of course! Χριστός ἀνέστη! – Ἀληθῶς ἀνέστη!) It is a fine summary of this day, and the very thing that is important about it.



A most happy and blessed Easter to everyone. This is The Great Day, and I am so glad to see all of you. You are blessed by coming because it is Christ himself who blesses you, and it is the angels and saints with us today in this place, who welcome you into the presence of God's glory.

This is not a day for unbelief. This is a day to be open to the great possibility that God is real; that Jesus is the Son of God come in the flesh; that He rose from the dead and somehow opened the door to eternal life for every human being who believes in Him. All of this may not be news to you, but the question it raises for some may be: Is this real?

Perhaps that question is yours. Things that are spiritual cannot be tested like things that are material, but the first step of belief is to ask: "Does all of this that we come to believe about God constitute converging and convincing arguments?" There is much spoken and written in Holy Scripture and through the teachings of the saints over the centuries that constitute these arguments.

Faith is a response to what God has revealed to us about himself, but it is more than that. Faith is a supernatural virtue given to us by God to help us believe. Our part is simply to be open to the possibility that there is a God who knows you, loves you and wants you to come to know and love Him. Altogether it is a rather simple thing, but the wonderful results of faith are profound.

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!

In the Church, the traditional greeting on Easter morning and throughout the Easter Octave is:
Christus surrexit! - Surrexit vere, allelúja
"Christ is risen!" - "He is risen indeed, Alleluia!"
This ancient phrase is similar to the Greek one, and echoes the greeting of the angel to Mary Magdalene and Mary, the mother of James, as they arrived at the sepulchre to anoint the body of Jesus: "He is not here; for he has risen, as he said" (Matthew 28:6 and Luke 24:6)
