



Dear Family,

Today we enter the Season of Advent, and we start a new liturgical year. Advent is a season rich in symbols and messages. The word "Advent" means "coming," and the implication is the coming of a King. This has a double meaning for us in this season. The first meaning is the coming of Christ at the end of time. This is perfectly depicted in the Gospel reading for today in which Our Lord tells us, "Be watchful! Be alert! ... you do not know when the lord of the house is coming."

This is a warning that Christ will appear at any time to bring an end to all the storms of time and to redeem all creation. Those who followed him in life will, at the end, follow him into eternity and into a new creation. Those who rejected him or were simply indifferent will not be a part of the redeemed creation, and it is for them that we must fervently pray.

This theme calls us to give thanks for what Jesus Our Lord began and continues to do for our sake. Instead of a warning, it is an invitation into a deep and abiding gratitude for the love poured down upon us by our savior.

God bless you all as we enter together into this season of Advent and prepare for the glorious season of Christmas.
