
# APRIL 28, 2024 5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Dear Family,

We heard last Sunday from the Acts of the Apostles:

"There is no salvation through anyone else (than Jesus)."

These were the words of St. Peter to the Sanhedrin, and this has been the gospel of the Church since that time.



This has raised a

natural question. What happened to those righteous people who lived before the Incarnation?

The Apostles' Creed has this phrase between the crucifixion and the resurrection: "...He descended into hell." This particular element of our faith was later called, *The Harrowing of Hell*.

After his death on the cross, Jesus descended into hell, not as some kind of punishment, which was not possible, but as a victorious conqueror, who battered down the gates of hell in order to release all the righteous people in the precincts of the nether world. The Old Testament called this place the underworld or "sheol."

There are many great works of art depicting scene, and in all of them, the demons flee before Jesus, and the grateful people rush toward him. It is an event of great hope for all of us. The one in whom we place our faith rules overall, even hell. He also rules over life in our world, even though it does not seem to be true in many circumstances, but we can see the truth of this belief through the eyes of faith. It is a reality to be seen and experienced in our own lives.

God bless you all in this Easter Season.

#### First Saturday Masses at Mary Immaculate Church near Williamsburg start next weekend

The Catholic Church of Mary Immaculate near Williamsburg in Greenbrier County will be the site of the First Saturday Mass beginning **May 4, 2024** and held monthly on the first Saturday thru October. The Rosary is prayed beginning at 10:30 a.m. with the daily Mass at 11 a.m. and a covered-dish picnic lunch following on the grounds.

Built in 1902, the 120-year-old church building is the oldest Catholic church building in Greenbrier County and was the third Catholic Church built to serve the Williamsburg Catholic congregation, which was made up primarily of the Irish and German population of northern Greenbrier County. The first two churches were destroyed by fires. Prior to establishing a church building in the early 1880s, the Irish and German congregation from the Williamsburg area would meet at the Corkrean's Store in Williamsburg at midnight on Saturday and walk the **18 miles** into Lewisburg for the early Sunday Mass in the former Immaculate Conception Catholic Church of Lewisburg.

Directions to Mary Immaculate: From Lewisburg, go north on Route 219 about 8 miles to the community of Frankford WV. Turn LEFT on Williamsburg Road (aka Route 17), and go about 5.3 miles. When the road forks, take the left fork, which keeps you on Williamsburg Road. (Do NOT go on to Germany Road, which is the right side of that fork.) Stay on Williamsburg Road – caution – it is a narrow road with two-way traffic. Turn Right on Catholic Church Road. The church is about ½ mile on your right.
