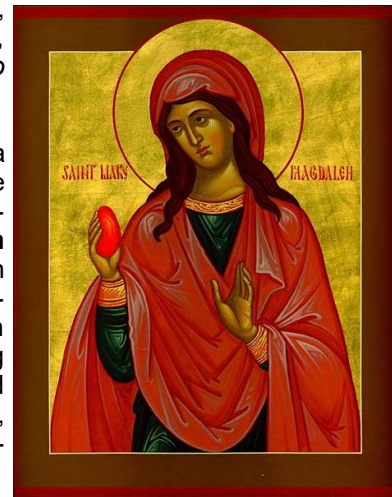
**APRIL 20, 2025**  
**EASTER SUNDAY**

Dear friends in Christ:  
**Christ is risen! Indeed He is!** This ancient Paschal Greeting – in Greek, **Christós anésti! Alethós anésti!**- typifies the stupendous joy of Easter morning, a joy which is so overwhelming and all encompassing that it spills over transforming the weekdays between Easter Sunday and Divine Mercy Sunday into a whole week of Sundays and demanding more than seven weeks to be fully expressed, such that each day between Easter Sunday and Pentecost, we ought greet each other with the joyful announcement, “Christ is Risen!” and respond, “Indeed he is.”

The Paschal Greeting is drawn from the Gospel narratives of the Resurrection and reverberates throughout the life of Saint Mary Magdalene. Saint Matthew tells us that when *Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb (28:1), they were greeted by an angel of the Lord who had descended from heaven, approached, rolled back the stone, and sat upon it (28:2). After frightening off the guard that had been posted at the Sanhedrin's request, the angel greeted the women saying, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; He has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay" (28:6). Faithful to the angel's command to go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him' (28:7), the women return to the Upper Room with the joyful news, the Magdalene gaining for herself that beautiful title, "Apostle to the apostles." Later in the day when Cleopas and his companion burst into the Upper Room with news of the encounter they had with the Risen Lord on the road to Emmaus, they are greeted by those gathered in the room, including the several Marys, with the announcement, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!" (Lk 24:34).*


According to tradition, soon after the Ascension and Pentecost, the Magdalene—a woman of some apparently significant means—took herself to Rome and gained the attention of the Emperor Tiberius Caesar during a public audience. In Saint Eusebius of Caesarea's accounting, the **Magdalene boldly proclaimed the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead**, while attempting to hand the Emperor an egg, an ancient symbol of new life and eternity in the great civilizations surrounding the Middle Sea, to illustrate her message of Resurrection and the possibility of New Life in Christ. Tiberius, not one for easy credulity on his best days, commenced mocking her, saying that Jesus had no more risen than the egg that she held out was red (red being the color Romans associated with divinity). Immediately, the egg turned red, illustrating the truth of her message. Mary held the crimson egg aloft and proclaimed, "He is risen indeed!"



Having gotten the Emperor's attention, she used the moment to both present some of Christ's teachings, in which Eusebius says that the Emperor "did not find anything preposterous," and then adduced a bill of complaints against Pilate for condemning an innocent man to death. The historical record indicates that Pontius Pilate was indeed removed as Governor of the Roman Province of Judea not later than 36 a.d. and recalled to Rome for trial before Tiberius, but that Tiberius' death delivered Pilate for any formal finding of maladministration, even though he was accused of a great number of extra-judicial killings in addition to the wrongful execution of Jesus Christ.

While Pilate disappears from the pages of history during the murky events of the reign of Caligula, the Magdalene's gleeful shout, "He is risen indeed!" continues to resound through the ages, often in the language she most certainly spoke them, "Alethós anéstí!"

In the Latin West, the Paschal Greeting was eventually incorporated into the Marian Antiphon of the Easter Season, the Regina Caeli: Regina caeli, laetare, alleluia.// Quia quem meruisti portare, alleluia. Resurrexit, sicut dixit, alleluia.// Ora pro nobis Deum, alleluia.

I encourage you, dear friends, to greet one another throughout the Easter season with the joyful announcement of Christ's Resurrection. I make it a habit during those 50 days to use "Happy Easter" as my common greeting at the beginning of my daily homily, which some may find somewhat pedantic along about week five. However, the Lord's Resurrection is our hope and the unending cause of our joy. Thus, we never tire of affirming, "Christ is risen; indeed, He is!"

Entrusting you and your families to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, our life and resurrection, I remain, ever affly yours *msgr kmq*
