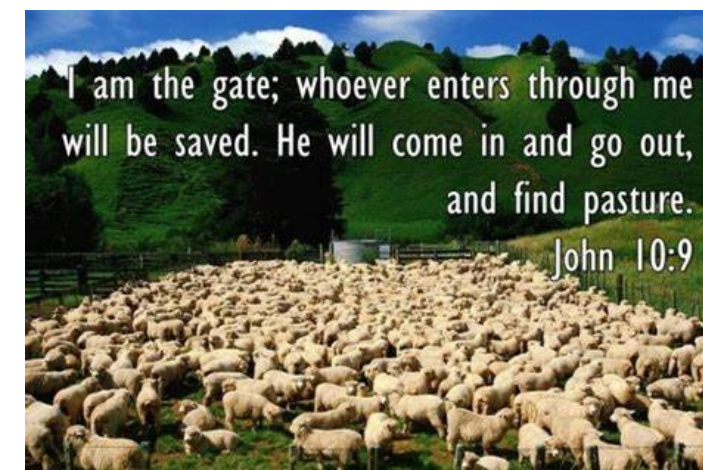

A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Family,

Deborah and I recently saw a new movie called “Nefarious.” It is a story about a serial killer who is scheduled to be executed for the multiple murders he committed. The whole movie takes place in an Oklahoma prison where a psychiatrist is tasked with determining that the convicted man is sane and therefore may be legally executed for his crimes, or insane which would preclude him from execution.

The psychiatrist, Dr. Martin, initially finds “Edward” to be typical of dissociative identity disorder (multiple personality), although Edward tells him that he is possessed by a demon called Nefarious, who has made him do “terrible things.” Dr. Martin is an atheist and does not believe in demons, until Nefarious, speaking through Edward, tells Dr. Martin too many things about himself that no one should know, such as events from his childhood or his relationship with his current girlfriend.

The movie very accurately portrays demonic behavior, according to the exorcist they had present during the filming. The genres of the movie are “horror” and “thriller,” but in fact is a Christian movie that deals effectively with the evil of the modern world. It is not a movie for everyone, but it does make plain the kind of spiritual battle of the modern day. In that sense, it is well worth watching this very challenging movie.

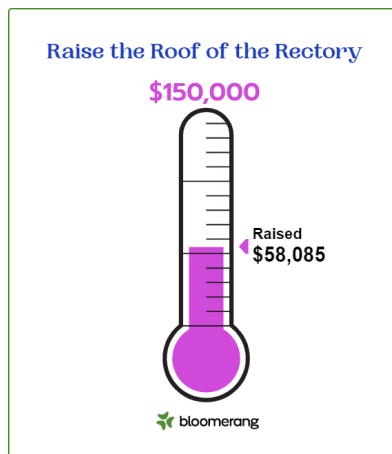
So far we have raised \$58,085.
