Future concerts will be on the following Sundays:

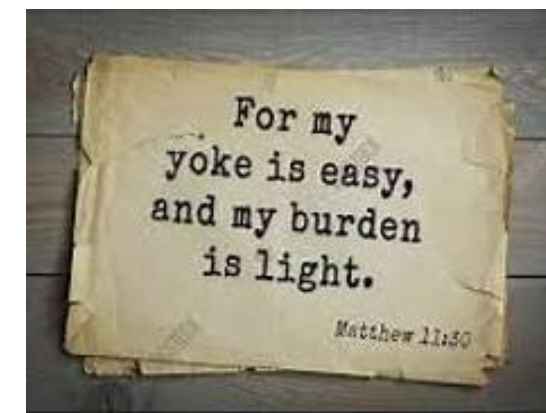

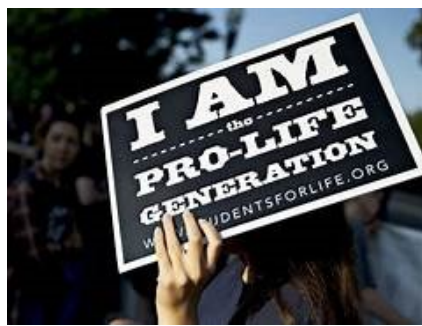

ROOF REPLACEMENT FUND UPDATE

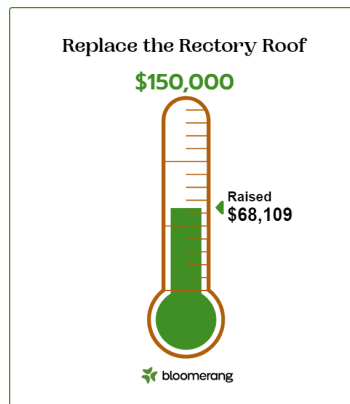
